Like everyone, Childrey residents pay a small element of their council tax bill as a village "precept"; money that does not go to the county for redistribution like the main bill, but is used to fund parish spending for the benefit of local residents. In Childrey our precept last year was £50 for a house falling in to Band D Council Tax (which is treated as the average).

This year the precept raised £12,200. Total expenditure will be £14,500 leaving a £2,300 deficit.

The deficit this financial year (FY) means the total balance in the PC's accounts brought forward at the start of the next FY will be significantly less than one's years expenditure. The PC is subject to a rule that says it must maintain a balance of reserves of between three and 12 months' expenditure. To put that in context, on present income we expect that at the end of FY23/24 the balance in reserve will be £4,900 less than our expenditure. Rising inflation and costs, combined with no new precept income (see later), is the issue.

So what does the PC pay for?

Grass cutting across the village and its environs, your newsletter, maintenance of village assets, insurance, legally-required independent auditing, support for the village hall, VAT of course and, finally, the salaries of our parish Clerk and our finance officer (these are set by national government not by the PC). Then there are individual items which, this year, have included emergency tree work and small contributions to village events like the wonderful Jubilee party (and our financial forecasts do not include any of these "extra" things). Parish councillors are unpaid volunteers, of course.

One of the things we love about Childrey is it's a small, unspoilt village. However, there's a downside to this. The amount a village raises from its precept is heavily dependent on how many properties it has. So new houses being built, or the presence of dense housing such as a retirement village, leads to a much larger income and can off-set inflationary costs. Childrey builds almost no new houses and doesn't have any dense housing.

All this means that to continue to be able to undertake services on behalf of parishioners, and avoid breaching the rules, the PC needs to raise the precept in Childrey.

The PC is proposing to raise the precept by £15 a year for a Band D property. Whilst £15 a year doesn't sound much, it will secure the village's finances in the year ahead and, barring exceptional circumstances, the one after that too. We all love living here, but keeping our village maintained happens thanks to this small budget.

## Advice to those with planning approval and their contractors.

There are few large developments within Childrey, however those residents who have building companies engaged to deliver their works should follow the guidelines laid out in the VWHDC website.

These are broadly define working hours as

- 7.30am to 6pm from Monday to Friday
- 8am to 1pm on Saturdays
- no noisy works on Sundays and Bank Holidays

The use of radios and other media players should not affect the properties around you.

Parking in Childrey is difficult and the parking of contractors' vans should not block access to neighbours' properties or block narrow roads.

Dust and waste materials should be kept under control and not be allowed to litter the area outside the construction site.

The rules on noise disturbance do not apply to DIY building works however please take sensible precautions to minimise any complaints from neighbours by:

- Apologising to them in advance for any disturbance caused by DIY.
- Tell them what it is you're doing. Try to agree times of work. Often neighbours will tolerate more disturbance for a short period if they know the work will be finished sooner.
- Think about your neighbour's circumstances. Do they have young children who go to bed early during the week? If so, negotiate to work longer during the weekend so as to minimise disturbance.
- Remember, at some stage your neighbour may wish to undertake DIY works you can hardly expect to be shown some consideration if you've ignored your neighbour's views!



## Reading Partners at King Alfred's - Update

The Reading Partners scheme restarted at the end of September, and the volunteers are just catching up with their training. It's not too late to join the team so do get in touch if you would like to know more about supporting the youngest pupils at King Alfred's with their reading. This is the latest from Alice Visser who leads the programme at the school: Once again we had fabulous results in 22-23 with the Reading Partners cohort. These students made on average 17 months progress over the period when they received support from you, which is about 3 times the amount of progress as the cohort as a whole. Equally important to the attainment progress is the change in reading attitudes and motivation that we saw amongst so many of the students you worked with; most of these students used to say 'I hate reading' or 'I'm not a reader', but they changed their self-perceptions and gained confidence through the Reading Partners sessions.
